

'Just dust' and ash

So ABC news decided that Dane Wigington is a nut, and chose not to give him much air time. Can you blame them? Not one credentialed atmospheric scientist or meteorologist buys into the chemtrails theory.

Wigington says they are all part of the conspiracy. His water tests are very misleading because he scoops up some mud with the water. Lab results, posted online for several of his samples, describe the medium tested as sludge, a mix of soil and water.
